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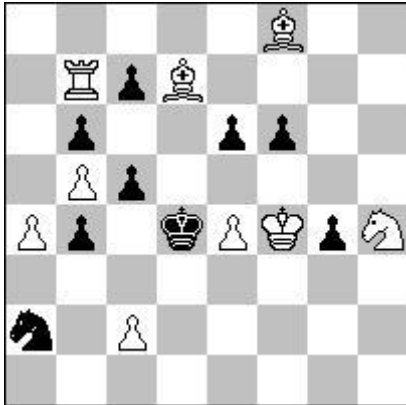

1. ... -90° 2. Bxe6 +90° 3. Sc3/Se3#

2. ... 180° 3. Sc6#

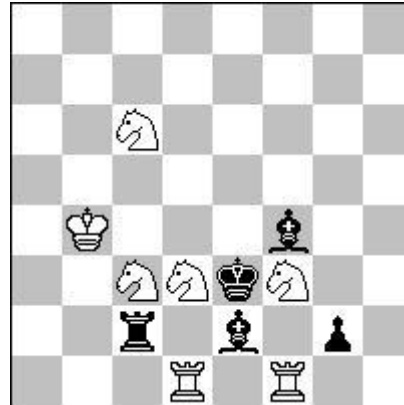
2. ... -90° 3. Bxd3#

Sd3, Sf3 were created by the change of pawns on the 8th line. By its capture in circechess, the pawn changed to the according knight, returns to the base field.

Solution:

AI: 1. Bxd3 (Pe2) Rxd3#

[not 1. Kxd3 (Pd2), not 1. Bxd3 (Pe2)].

All: 1. Kxf3 (Pf2) Sc5#

[not Sde5#? because of Bxe5!

- Sf3 is creating from Pf2].

BI: 1. Bxf3 (Pe2) Rxf3#

[not 1. Kxf3 (Pf2), not 1. Bxd3 (Pe2)].

BII: 1. Kxd3 (Pd2) Se1#

[not Sc5#? because of Bxe5!

- Sd3 is creating from Pd2]

CI: 1. Kxf3 (Pf2) Sc5#

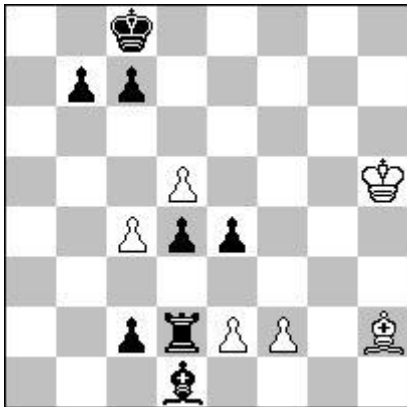
[not 1. Bxf3 (Pe2)].

CII: 1. Kxd3 (Pd2) Se1#
